A new study is being conducted through Tufts University to evaluate "The Effect of Pecans on Biomarkers of Risk for Cardiovascular Disease." Initial results expect that the research will show "a handful of pecans a day can keep adults healthy and lower the risk of heart disease, diabetes and life threatening diseases."

NPSA holds two meetings a year; a Mid-Winter Meeting in the spring and an Annual Meeting in the fall. Attendance at these meetings provides your company with valuable networking opportunities as well as updates from experts on trends, manufacturing and general business information.
